Notes (备注):

1. **I Can Speak Chinese** includes games and activities that focus on listening and speaking, such as morning circle, musical chairs, clothes pin games, and catch the ball games.
2. **Culture Projects** includes songs and crafts that teach students about the culture of China. For example, through make-a-panda craft, students learn about where the pandas live, what food they eat and how we can protect them from becoming extinct. Other projects include making Terra Cotta figures, building the Great Wall, and making a dragon.
3. **I Can Read Chinese** focus on learning to read and write Chinese through fun, engaging, sensory activities. Reading games include “Guess what’s in the bag?”, “Grab the word you know”, and “Connecting the train”. Writing activities include stencil writing, making words with rice, etc.
4. We use **Abacus** as a tool to teach Chinese as well as to enhance arithmetic skills for the age appropriate group.
5. In the **Cooking** class, students’ vocabulary will be reinforced by learning how to cook some traditional Chinese foods.
6. **Martial Arts/Karate** class is taught by outside expert teachers. (No additional fee for these classes for our campers.)
7. At 2:00pm on each Friday, our students put on a **Performance Show** showcasing all that they have learned during the week. Parents are very welcome to attend. Show is free and open to all.
8. There is mid-morning snack time for young age groups.
